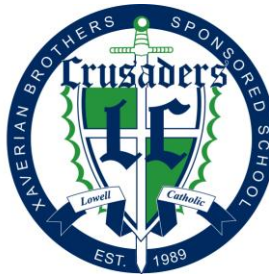


WHO SHOULD ENROLL IN SUMMER REMEDIATION?

Students receiving a final grade of a “D” are strongly encouraged to remediate this class in the summer. Through this program, students have the chance to fine-tune the necessary skills in a particular subject before moving on to the next year. In addition, the remediated grade will be added to a student’s transcript and overall GPA.

Students who have received **less than a 65%** in a class are **required to remediate** that course during the summer program.

Students who receive **less than a 45%** in a class are **not able to remediate** during summer school and must **retake the course the following academic year**.

Full-Year Courses:

- ⊗ English I, II, III, IV

DRESS CODE

Students must adhere to the casual day dress code in the student handbook. Clothing may not display inappropriate language or graphics. Skirts/shorts of modest length may be worn. The length of all skirts/shorts must fall below the fingertips when your arms are resting at your sides.

The following articles of clothing are not considered part of the summer dress code:

- ⊗ Sunglasses, hats, strapless tops, bathing suits, spaghetti strap tank tops, and low-cut shirts

Student found in violation will be sent home and required to change clothes before being permitted back into the school building.

LOSS OF CREDIT

The following infractions could lead to a loss of credit, withdrawal from summer school, and forfeiture of fees.

- ⊗ More than 3 absences in a full-year course or more than 2 absences in a semester course
- ⊗ More than 6 tardies in a full-year course or more than 2 tardies in a semester course
- ⊗ Involvement in a fight
- ⊗ Possession of drugs/alcohol/weapon
- ⊗ Stealing or cheating
- ⊗ Truancy
- ⊗ Smoking
- ⊗ Insubordination / Disruptive Behavior

Depending on the seriousness of the infraction, other consequences may be pursued (i.e. expulsion or police involvement)

POLICIES

- ⊗ Registration forms must be signed and payment made **by June 18th**. Payments after this date will incur a \$30 late fee. **No registrations are accepted after June 30th.**
- ⊗ Attendance is mandatory. Absences are allowed for sickness/emergency. Vacation days are **not** acceptable reasons for absence.
- ⊗ **Students are not permitted to leave school grounds between classes for any reason.** Vending machines are located in the cafeteria where students will find a variety of drink and snack selections.
- ⊗ Course offerings and session times are determined by enrollment and teacher availability.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds for withdrawal from a course are given based on the following schedule:

Remediation of full-year courses:

- ⊗ 80% refund- withdrawal before end of first week
- ⊗ 60% refund- withdrawal before end of second week
- ⊗ No refund- withdrawal after the second week

Remediation of semester courses:

- ⊗ 50% refund- withdrawal before third class
- ⊗ No refund- withdrawal after third day of class
